Whole Trust Approach

E-safety in the curriculum

ICT and online resources are increasingly used across the curriculum. We believe it is essential for e.safety guidance to be given to the pupils on a regular and meaningful basis. We continually look for new opportunities to promote e-safety.

E-mail

The use of email across the Trust is an essential means of communication for all. In the context of the Trust, email should not be considered private.

Pupils will be advised never to give out personal details of any kind which may identify them or their location.

Publishing pupil's images and work

Each academic year all parents/carers will be asked to give permission for their child's photo to be taken and to use their child's work/photos in line with Policy for the safe use of children's photographs.

Social networking and personal publishing

We block/filter access to social networking sites. Pupils and parents will be advised that the use of social network spaces outside school is inappropriate for primary aged pupils.

Data Protection

Personal data will be recorded, processed, transferred and made available according to the current GDPR data protection legislation, as stated in the Trust's Data Protection Policy.

Cyberbullying

Fierté Charitable Trust will not tolerate Cyberbullying and work in partnership with parents / carers and pupils to educate them about Cyberbullying as part of internet safety.

Working in Partnership with Parents/Carers

Pupils will discuss and sign Acceptable use agreements with their class teachers. Parents/carers are also asked to read through and sign acceptable use of ICT agreements on behalf of their child. Parents/carers are required to make a decision as to whether they consent to images of their child being taken/used in the public domain (e.g. on school website). A partnership approach with parents will be encouraged.

Monitoring and evaluation

The policy will be monitored and evaluated regularly taking into account any incidents which occur or technological developments which might need a change in the policy.
