

Forests are a vital source of energy, providing wood for cooking, playing a key role in agriculture by hosting pollinators and acting in soil enrichment, climate regulation and biodiversity conservation. In addition, forested watersheds supply freshwater to more than 85% of the world's major cities. In crisis situations, forests become an economic and food lifeline, providing up to 20% of family income in rural areas, guaranteeing healthy diets. But these ecosystems are in danger. We lose 10 million hectares annually due to deforestation and approximately 70 million hectares affected by fires. Protecting and restoring our forests is urgent and necessary: the

Nursery have been celebrating British Science week, learning about growth, colour and lifecycles. We have been planting our own flowers and starting to grow vegetables. They are looking forward to tasting the Tomatoes, Radishes and Lettuces when they are ready to Harvest. We have been learning about the lifecycle of a Frog, from Frogspawn to Tadpoles, and Froglets to Frogs, and measuring how many Leap Frog jumps we can do. Chromatography and Tie-dye have been explored, creating beautiful rainbows and watching the colours separate and spread.
